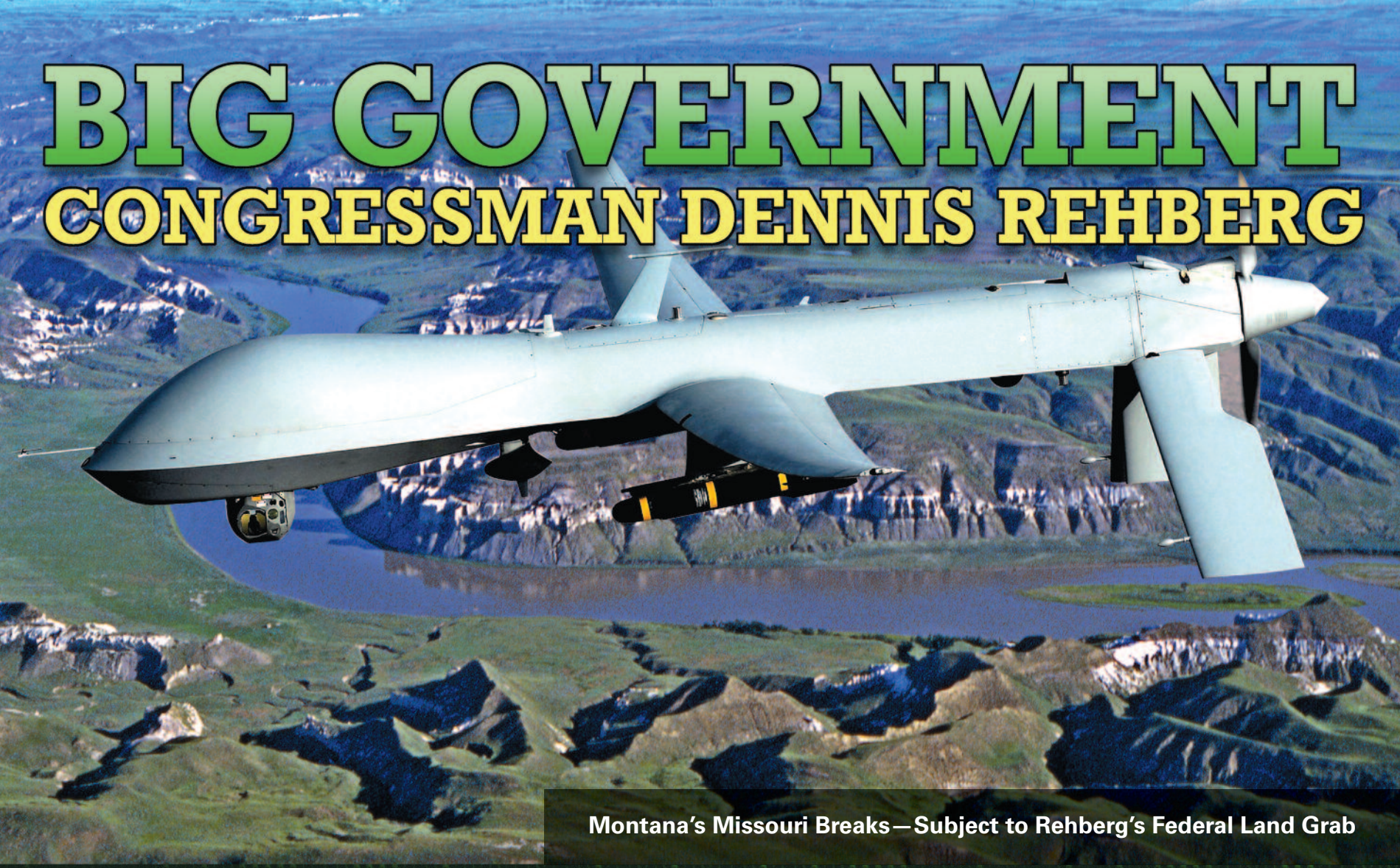

Montana's Missouri Breaks—Subject to Rehberg's Federal Land Grab

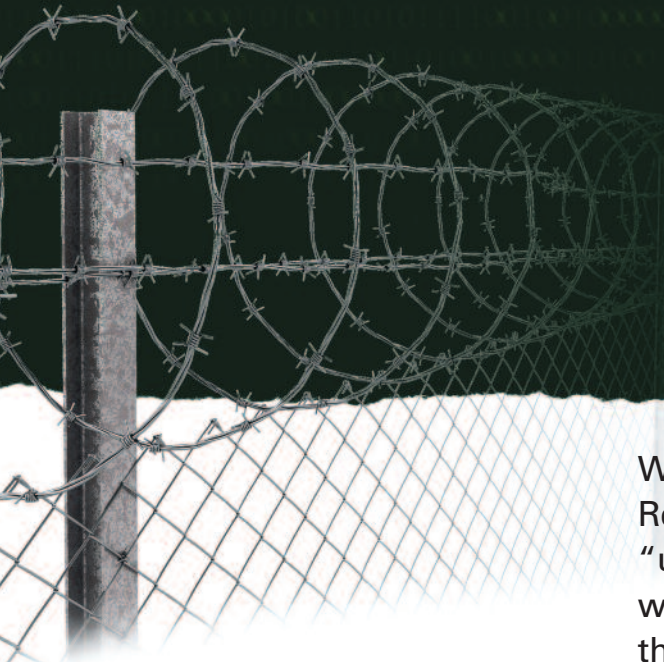
LET'S COMPARE:

Dennis Rehberg

- ▶ Took control of Montana's classrooms away from teachers with the No Child Left Behind Act
- ▶ Voted 5 times for the unpopular Patriot Act
- ▶ Supported and passed a National ID Card—Real ID

- ▶ As a former teacher, supports local control of education
- ▶ Joined Montanans in consistently opposing the Patriot Act

Without listening to the concerns of Montanans, Congressman Dennis Rehberg passed H.R. 1505, a "federal land grab" bill, which gives "unprecedented power" to federal bureaucrats to control public lands within 100 miles of Montana's northern border. Under Rehberg's bill, the Department of Homeland Security can build roads, watchtowers and buildings on public lands and deny hunters and anglers access to the some of Montana's best places to hunt and fish—with no public input.
