Working for Montana Women

Jon has fought relentlessly throughout his career to guarantee equal rights and opportunity for Montana women.

CHOICE

Jon strongly believes in the rights of women to make their own health care decisions and has consistently pushed back on efforts to undermine that – earning a 100% pro-choice voting record.

Jon has repeatedly opposed partisan efforts to undermine family planning organizations that serve nearly 13,000 Montanans annually for critical health services like annual exams and cancer screening.

PREVENTIVE CARE

Jon has relentlessly pushed back on attempts to allow women to be charged more for health insurance and to roll back protections for critical women's health care services like mammograms, cancer screenings, and prenatal care.

Jon introduced the Save Women's Preventive Care Act to require insurers cover services including birth control and breast cancer screenings, and fought to require employer coverage of birth control after the Supreme Court's Hobby Lobby decision.

WORKPLACE

Jon believes it's crazy we're still having a debate over equal pay for women, and has cosponsored and voted for legislation to ensure equal pay six times. Jon fought to expand family leave and pushed to give pregnant women more health care options.

Jon voted to prevent employers from discriminating against pregnant workers and to reauthorize a strengthened Child Care and Development Block Grant that banned states from immediately terminating child care assistance if parents lost their jobs.

COMBATING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

Jon has consistently fought to ensure law enforcement, advocates, and victims have the resources they need to combat the scourge of sexual assault and domestic violence.

Jon cosponsored and voted for the successful reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act, a landmark law that created and expanded programs to assist communities with law enforcement and aid for victims.

Jon also voted to fund health and medical care for trafficking victims and to require the Department of Defense to include information about military sex offenders in the National Sex Offender Registry.
